The First Ninety Days: Lessons Learned from the Integration of Protection Principles in The Delivery of Health Programmes in Bidi Bidi, Uganda, The World's Largest Refugee Camp

SPEAKER:

Amelia Shepherd-Smith is a new research associate and the Monitoring and Evaluation Officer at the Gender, Health & Justice Research Unit (GHJRU). She is an expert in international development and humanitarian emergencies, particularly the Protection of Children and Women in conflict-affected countries.

One of her most recent African missions was in South Sudan where she worked for the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR). In 2014/2015 she worked in the Protection Cluster of the UNHCR as a Monitoring and Reporting Specialist, and in 2016, for UNHCR's Internally Displaced Person's Unit as an Associate Protection Officer. When South Sudan's peace negotiations broke down in July 2016, forcing the mass movement of civilians to neighbouring Uganda, Amelia was redeployed to the Emergency Response Team, which coordinated the South Sudanese Refugee Response in Uganda. She will be presenting on lessons learned in the delivery of health programmes in refugee camps.
