

Educating Deaf Children:
Becoming an Empowered
Teacher



At the heart of the United Nations
Sustainable Development Goals is the
pledge to leave no one behind and create a
"just, equitable, tolerant, open and socially
inclusive world in which the needs of the
most vulnerable are met". A key strategy for
realising these goals in relation to children
with disabilities, is to upskill and empower
teachers to become agents of change in
their communities. This is a fundamental
objective of the Teacher Empowerment for
Disability Inclusion (TEDI) project which is
launching its very first Massive Open Online
Course (MOOC): Educating Deaf Children:
Becoming an Empowered Teacher.



What is the TEDI project?

The TEDI project is a partnership between the University of Cape Town (UCT) and Christoffel-Blinden Mission (CBM), and is co-funded by the European Union and CBM, aims to empower teachers to provide quality education for learners with severe to profound sensory or intellectual impairments through training that is focused on inclusivity, diversity and addressing learners' impairment-specific needs.



What is a MOOC?

MOOCs are self-directed online courses that are developed by universities and hosted on web platforms such as Coursera. Massive open online courses are not for university credit, so assessments are voluntary, and participants who complete the course can choose to pay for a certificate.



What is the Educating Deaf Children online course about?

Drawing on our own research within the TEDI project, in this online course we explore how being Deaf impacts on children's learning and development, and how educators can modify the learning environment and make accommodations to meet the needs of Deaf children, develop their resilience, and support them holistically.

The course topics include:

- The experience of being Deaf and how it impacts learning
- The role of teachers in developing resilience in Deaf children
- Creating an accessible learning experience
- Becoming an empowered teacher

While the online course is open to anyone, it will be of particular relevance to educators (including classroom teachers, learning support teachers, teacher assistants and principals) who are responsible for supporting the education of learners who are Deaf.

The course should take you about three hours a week over four weeks, which you can choose to do whenever it suits you. There are short video lectures, readings and quizzes to help you learn. Discussion forums and peer reviewed assignments offer an opportunity to hear from other people taking the course. If you fall behind, there are no penalties, you can join the next course and pick up where you left off.

You will be asked for your full name, email address and a password.

Once you have completed these details, navigate to the course: www.coursera.org/learn/ educating-deaf-children and click on the enrol button.

You will be offered two options - to pay for a certificate (purchase the course) or to enrol for the full course with no certificate (taking the course for free).
