Masters programmes are research driven and aim to produce new and relevant knowledge to transform and develop Occupational Therapy practice.

#### The following options are available:

MSc in Occupational Therapy by dissertation (MM005) for students wishing to pursue an indepth research study in an area of occupational therapy. The programme includes a compulsory semester course in Research Methods. Students may study a topic of their choice or take on a research work recommended by the Division.

MSc in Occupational Therapy by coursework and dissertation (MM018). This three year part-time, or two-year full time coursework and dissertation programme is offered to graduates who want to learn more about the profession and explore topics in greater depth than at undergraduate level.

**Individual courses for non-degree purposes.** A maximum of two courses may be taken without registering for the degree.

# MSc in Occupational Therapy by coursework and dissertation (MM018)

This programme consists of **six courses and a minor dissertation**. Not all courses are offered every year.

#### **Compulsory courses:**

- Research Methods (AHS5014F)<sup>1</sup>
   Theory of qualitative and quantitative research methods and applied through
  - research methods and applied through exercises and the preparation of a research proposal.
- Research Methods II (AHS5018S)<sup>1</sup>
  Advanced theoretical preparation for

planning, executing and reporting research with a major focus on further development of the research proposal.

 Human Occupation: Theory & Critique (AHS5015F)<sup>2</sup>

This course takes a strong occupational science stance with a focus on the meta-theoretical basis for understanding and using occupation in occupational therapy practice.

 Occupational Therapy: Identities & Practices (AHS5016F)<sup>3</sup>

This course explores the phenomenon of occupation within the context of daily life and across the lifespan in order to inform occupation centred practice.

#### A choice of any 2 of the following:

### Occupational Therapy in Primary Health Care (AHS5044S)<sup>1</sup>

This course examines the role of occupational therapy in comprehensive primary health care (PHC) and considers how the PHC philosophy and approach can be facilitated through occupation-centred programmes within the district health system and the context of national and international policies.

## Occupation-Based Community Development Practice (AHS5045S)<sup>2</sup>

The course explores the interrelationships and interconnections between the environment and occupations to promote health, well-being and social justice for marginalised and vulnerable groups.

# • Introduction to Disability as Diversity (AHS4089F)<sup>3</sup>

The course presents the shifts towards viewing disability as a human rights issue by focussing on the individual, social and psycho-analytical models of disability. Issues of power and privilege are introduced and theories on identities, sharing and resistance to oppression

explored. Marginalisation and exclusion and their intersections with disability are considered.

#### **Admission requirements**

- Degree in occupational therapy or equivalent qualification recognised by the Senate.
- Minimum of two years practice experience is recommended.
- Registration with the Health Professions
   Council of South Africa or equivalent body
   in the country in which research will be
   conducted.
- Computer literacy.
