#### WHY OCCUPATIONAL MEDICINE?

Work-related ill-health is associated with disability and poor quality of life of workers. In South Africa there are only approximately 50 occupational medicine specialists serving 17 million workers. Clinical capacity in occupational medicine is underdeveloped resulting in under-recognition of occupational disease, inappropriate referral, poor clinical management and compensation of workers. Early access to care improves outcomes and decreases morbidity and mortality.

**SAMPLE TOPICS INCLUDE:** Diagnosis, assessment of impairment, management and compensation of...

- Pneumoconioses (silcosis, asbestosis)
- Occupational allergy and work-related asthma
- Occupational dermatitis
- Work-related musculoskeletal disorders
- Diabetes, cardiovascular and other NCDs
