#### Funding Opportunity Announcement NIH: Dissemination and Implementation Research in Health

The purpose of this call is to support studies that will identify, develop, and/or test strategies for overcoming barriers to the adoption, adaptation, integration, scale-up, and sustainability of evidence-based interventions, practices, programs, tools, treatments, guidelines, and policies. Studies that promote equitable dissemination and implementation of evidence-based interventions among underrepresented communities are encouraged. Conversely, there is a benefit in understanding circumstances that create a need to stop or reduce (de-implement) the use of practices that are ineffective, unproven, low-value, or harmful. In addition, studies to advance dissemination and implementation research methods and measures are encouraged. Applications that focus on re-implementation of evidence-based health services (e.g. cancer screening) that may have dropped off amidst the ongoing COVID pandemic are encouraged.

### The National Institute of Health (NIH) have announced three linked funding opportunities:

#### R03 Small Grant Program (PAR-22-106)

- Direct costs of up to \$50,000 per year may be requested
- Maximum project period is 2 years

#### R01 Research Project Grant (PAR-22-105)

- Budgets are not limited but need to reflect the actual needs of the proposed project
- Maximum project period is 5 years

## R21 Exploratory/Developmental Grant (PAR-22-109)

- Combined budget for direct costs for the two-year project period may not exceed \$275,000. No more than \$200,000 may be requested in a single year
- Maximum project period is 2 years

This proposal requires the PI to complete an online application on the funder portal (ASSIST) as well as requesting institutional approval via UCT's electronic Research Administration (eRA) system, prior to submission of the application. NOTE: Final submission of an application on ASSIST is actioned by UCT's Research Contracts and Innovation (RC&I) office.
