WHY THIS COURSE



Adolescence is a critical transitional phase where the foundations for future health and well-being are laid. With the unique challenges that young people face in SSA, there is a pressing need for targeted interventions that address both the biological and social determinants of health. This course bridges the gap between theory and practice, enabling you to translate evidence into action effectively.

SOLUTIONS



The AHI short course replaces an Adolescent and Youth Health Policy (AYHP) short course which successfully ran in 2018 - 2019. We are reintroducing the course in 2024 with a greater focus on implementation science. Each week of the course, participants must complete assigned pre-readings and watch three pre-recorded presentations of approximately 20 minutes each before the live weekly discussion sessions.
