<b>Postgraduate Diploma in Community Eye Health (PgDCEH)</b>	Provides training in eye care programme management to plan, organise and manage community eye health programmes at national, district or facility level. It does not provide a clinical training in ophthalmology.	Duration: one year (February to November) Structure: Four (4) semester courses delivered in blended format. First 6 contact weeks in Cape Town (mid-February to end-March), followed by synchronous and asynchronous online lecture sessions. <b>Master of Surgery (Community Eye Health) (MScCEH)</b>  <b>NB: This replaces the Master of Public Health (Community Eye Health track)</b>	Provides supervision and support to enable participants to undertake research that might inform the planning and management of eye care programmes. It does not provide a clinical training in ophthalmology. <b>LAM: Leadership and management (for strengthened public eye health services)</b>	Provides participants with the core leadership and management skills needed for effective planning, design, and implementation of improved eye care services through development of personal leadership and management strategies.	Duration: 1 week contact / 12 weeks online Structure: 1 week contact workshop (March) or 12 weekly sessions delivered online in asynchronous mode (starts April). Practical exercises and assignments must be completed.	
<b>PME: Project management essentials (for strengthened public eye health services)</b>	Provides training and support to enable participants to develop comprehensive project plans, from conception to feasibility assessment and marketing, based on the project management approach.	Duration: 1 week contact / 12 weeks online Structure: 1 week contact workshop (March) or 12 weekly sessions delivered online in asynchronous mode (starts July). Post-training support is provided for completion of project plans, evaluated, and ready for marketing.	
<b>CEH: Community eye health (for strengthened public eye health services)</b>	Provides participants with the core knowledge and understanding of community eye health, the discipline which focuses on designing and implementing public health interventions against needless blindness and visual impairment.	Duration: 12 weekly sessions starting February Structure: Synchronous and asynchronous online lecture sessions, about key aspects of community eye health. Ideal for district level eye care service managers. Practical exercises and assignments, including development of a district eye care plan.
