Online Essentials Of Nursing Children with a Tracheostomy Course

Learning outcomes

At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- 1. Articulate their role, within the complex system and environments in which children with tracheostomies are nursed to ensure safe and efficient care for best possible outcomes.
- 2. Explain the anatomical, physiological and developmental differences across the age-span of a child, and how this impacts the indication for a tracheostomy, the procedure and the required nature of care.
- 3. More confidently provide safe, quality, evidence-based nursing care to children with a tracheostomy using the Regul8 Framework as a guide.
- 4. Recognise and utilise the important supportive role and resource of the principal caregiver and family in the pathway of a child with a tracheostomy.

N.B. It is to be noted that the course contains information relevant to all health professionals working with children with tracheostomies but it is written by nurses, with a focus on nursing.
