# **Basic Essay Structure**

#### Introduction

In the introduction, you prepare the reader for what they will encounter in your essay by:

- Describing the general context for the topic of the essay
- Telling your reader what you will focus on within this topic
- Telling your reader something about how you will approach the topic/how you have structured your essay
- Giving the reader an indication of where you are leading them/your conclusion (hint: you can only write this once you have written the rest of the essay and reached a conclusion)

#### **Body**

In the body of your essay, you will discuss different aspects of your topic, one at a time, and in a logical order using multiple paragraphs

### **Paragraph**

Each paragraph should have a clear focus and present a comprehensive discussion or argument about some aspect of your topic by:

- Telling your reader what the paragraph is about (topic sentences)
- Giving your reader some information about the paragraph topic (integrating sources)
- Proving an example or two to show that you understand how this information applies or is relevant in a real-world context
- Analysing the relationship between the information and examples, to reach a conclusion (deeper understanding/new learning) about the paragraph topic
- Providing a link that logically guides your reader towards the topic of the next paragraph

### Conclusion

In the conclusion, you present a summary of the different conclusions you have reached in the body of your essay by:

- Reminding your reader about where you started this discussion (the focus of your essay)
- Giving your reader a summary of the conclusions you reached in each section or paragraph
- Telling your reader what you think this means when you consider it these conclusions all together
- Saying something about why this is important
- Linking your conclusions back to the general context for the topic of your essay (hint: this is a link back to your introduction)

## References

Your reference list should be a comprehensive list of all the sources you have referenced in your essay. The structure of your reference list will depend upon any specific instruction you have been given and/or the referencing style you are using
